

RECIPES

Chocolate Brownies

Ingredients-

- -250g of butter
- -4 eggs
- -2 cups of caster sugar
- -1/2 cup of plain flour
- -3/4 cup cocoa powder
- 1 teaspoon of vanilla extract

Method for Chocolate Brownies

Step 1-Preheat oven to 180°C. Line a 20 x 30cm (base measurement) slab pan with non-stick baking paper.


Step 2-Heat butter, chocolate and sugar in a saucepan over low heat, stirring constantly, until melted and smooth. Transfer to a heatproof bowl. Set aside to cool slightly.

Step 3- Add eggs and vanilla to chocolate mixture. Mix well. Sift flour and cocoa over chocolate mixture. Stir to combine.

Step 4- Pour brownie mixture into pan. Bake for 20 minutes or until just set. Set aside to cool. Once cooled, lift out. Wrap in plastic wrap. Place into an airtight container. Stand for 1 day. Cut into pieces. Serve.



Keskul - Palace style pudding





Keskul is a very practical and nutritious gluten free pudding. It is one of the oldest Ottoman recipes served to public by the palace to celebrate war victories, religious holidays and other significant occasions.

INGRÆDIÆNTS

150 g Antep pistachio kernels
150 g Almond halves or flakes

100 g rice flour or corn flour

450 g sugar

2 lt. Full cream Milk

Pomegranate pearls for decoration

МЕТНОД:

Crush the almonds in a mortar and pestle then pulse the pistachios in a food processor

Dilute rice flour in a cup of lukewarm milk, then combine milk, rice flour mix, pistachios and sugar in a pot

Cook approximately for 5 minutes or until mixture is hot but not boiled mixing continuously

Add crushed almonds in to the mixture, then boil once then simmer for approximately for 5 minutes or until the mixture is thickened

Divide the mixture in to cups or bowls and refrigerate for 3 hours, then decorate with pomegranate pearls
