

2020 Classes - At this time of year parents are always starting to ask questions about next years' classes, so I'm putting out some information about our class formation processes.

- 1. Students are matched to the teacher who will suit them (research has this as the biggest factor affecting student learning and wellbeing).
- 2. Students are put into groups with a variety of abilities and behaviours.
- 3. Where possible students are separated from students they don't work well with or clash with.
- 4. Students have other children in their group they are known to work well with. More details will be published on Skoolbag.

Classes for 2020 – Please make sure you return your form by this Friday, so we can start looking at the best class teacher and peers for your child/children next week, as there are only four weeks of the school year left!

End of Year Celebration Assemblies and Kindergarten Graduation are nearly upon us! These all start at 9:15 on the date specified and are followed by a morning tea (please bring a plate of food to share) in the green area, weather permitting- if inclement we will move indoors. It is a nice way for you to celebrate their learning this year and an opportunity to chat to their teacher.

Coriander

1 tsp pomegranate vinegar

1 Tsp avocado oil

1 tsp maple syrup

1/2 tsp grainy mustard

salt and pepper to taste

Snap snowpeas in half
Tear herbs off stalks. pop it in a bowl.
Add dressing ingredients to a small jar,
shake vigorously and pour over greens.

As part of the Inner West Council's EDGE festival MyKindCo Creative Collective is engaging the Balmain community in the live process of art and design over the 3 days of the festival, through creative installations and children's workshops.

Curated by MyKindCo Founder and Creative Director Lisa Tatman, the activations are inspired by the creativity, influence and engagement of women in our Balmain community, both past and present.

'The Art of Play' Mural is being painted by Lotte Alexis Smith across the three days of the festival at the wall of the Little Treasure Chest toy store on the corner of Darling and Booth St, opposite heritage listed Gladstone Park. The historically and locally inspired mural represents the great sense of community established through play and our local schools, diversity and inclusion, and the significance of women and children in our community.

Maybanke Anderson was a remarkable and significant Balmain local woman in the late 1800s and early 1900s, when the original store H.A. Scott & Co's -The Strand, was established at the site of the mural at the Little Treasure Chest site.

Maybanke was a leading feminist, teacher, historian and writer, passionate about both the rights of women and children. She was a uniting force behind women's suffrage in NSW campaigning for progressive social reform through the establishment of free kindergartens, children's playgrounds, a girls school, women's advanced education, law reform the including women's right to vote in 1902. Maybanke was a mother of seven children and a true inspiration for MyKindCo - Creative Collective and a history making influential identity we wish to now share with our broader peninsula community.

"The mural will be a creative installation celebrating diversity and inclusion, unity of women and children of Balmain past and present. The MyKindCo ethos is built on the strength of women building a united community for both the greater good of womankind and of our children- the next generation. The mural installation will be a welcome reminder of this and for the community to celebrate for years to come", said Lisa Tatman.

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On Saturday 23rd and Sunday the 24th of November, children have a rare opportunity to engage in the 'Art of Play and Design' workshops, with a line-up of our Balmain community's top female designers, architects, artists and photographers, generously sharing their expertise in our play and create sessions:

- Design your own dollhouse with Interior Designers
- · Build your own Balmain terrace with an Architect
- Create your own logo 'identity' with a team of Art Directors
- Experience a live photoshoot with a fine art Photographer and creative team

The workshops will be held at Balmain's newest boutique toy store the 'Little Treasure Chest'. A **Christmas Kindness Wishing Tree** will also be installed, inviting the local community to come together in store to gift 'treasures' to children and families in need of some kindness in their world this Christmas. All donations will be directed to local charity Mummies Paying it Forward.

Over the last week, local primary school children have also been highly engaged creating 'wishing tags' inscribed with their wishes for the future and a 'kinder' world. These colourful tags will abundantly decorate the **MyKindCo Wishing Tree** installation on the corner of Booth Street and Darling St surrounding the store and the mural, opposite the park.

The wishes of the children and the festival attendees, will also be shared and showcased on the MyKindCo Wishing Arch activation. This will be located at the entry to the MyKindCo 'Art of Play' Children's Lawn Party an installation of traditional imaginative 'screen free' play at Jazz in the Park, at Gladstone Park, on the final day of the festival- Sunday 24 November
