

Mathematics K-2



As with the new English syllabus, the new Maths syllabus is currently being implemented in Kindergarten to Year 2 and will be rolled out to stages 2 and 3 next year.

The Department of Education has provided us with extra release time to allow teachers to engage with the new syllabus documents to ensure teaching and learning reflects the new outcome structure.

The new Maths syllabus has a greater focus on working mathematically and developing reasoning skills, to support students to make connections across concepts and develop the skills to apply mathematical techniques to solve problems.

Maths skills are cumulative and students who have a limited understanding of foundation number and place value often find other concepts challenging. To support all learners to grow, develop and extend their number skills we are implementing stage-based number groups in Years 1-6.

We have allocated time and resources to each stage to place the students in smaller groups to allow targeted explicit instruction in whole number and place value. The groups are dynamic, and we will use pre and post assessment data to continuously inform the program and groupings. Mrs Mitchell, Mrs Dennis and Ms Mackay will support the classroom teachers by programming for and working with a group.

We are really excited to implement the groups and hopefully see the students understanding of mathematical problem-solving grow as a result. If you have any questions at all, please email your child's teacher or Rebecca.boyle11@det.nsw.edu.au
