#### A Message from the Principal

This week has seen our fabulous **NAIDOC** activities. Thank you, Aunty Bronwyn and Aunty Francis! We have enjoyed our time with you and learnt so much.

Mr Maglis came with an incredible team of Sydney Secondary College Balmain students to conduct a great **STEM lesson with Stage 3** and Student Parliament raised money to clean up our oceans for **World Oceans Day**.

**Updates from our SIP** (Strategic Improvement Plan 2024-2027) – some information on some of the activities that aren't posted on the forward-facing pages on the school website.

Homework Review – During term 2, in partnership with the P&C, we held a forum where staff and parents could share their thoughts on how homework is being implemented across the school. To add to the great information received at the forum, we will be sending a parent survey home early term 3. It would be great if as many families as possible can complete it as a priority, so we have the whole community perspective. After the data is analysed, we will develop our new homework procedures.

In term 1 teachers developed a **whole school goal** that will drive our professional learning. Our goal is to: "Improve the quality of communication and community connection among students, teachers, and parents by highlighting achievements, sharing important information and providing more opportunities for parent involvement." Initiatives so far include things like our class-led assemblies, regular 'Information Updates" by email the Parent Homework Forum.

As a part of our **professional learning**, the school executive will be attending Growth Coaching International professional learning in term 3. The course, "The Impact Cycle and giving instructional feedback through a coaching approach", will help with the delivery of critical feedback on teaching observations using a coaching approach. To build on this approach, all teachers will participate in whole school professional learning to further develop their own growth coaching skills.

All teachers have been attending professional learning on the implementation of the new English and Mathematics Syllabus.

It's the end of term 2 already and we are halfway through the year. It's been an exciting semester with lots of learning and fun activities. Thank you to all our parents, staff and students for your hard work, support, and sense of fun! I hope you all have some family fun over the next two weeks.

Education Week is in week 3 next term, and we are plotting a special event for our families. I'm looking forward to seeing you there.




## **NAIDOC Week**
